

PD TEESPORT LIMITED SCHEDULE OF CONSERVANCY DUES

Effective 1st January 2025 until further notice

Ship, Passenger and Goods Dues

PD Teesport Limited ("PDT") is the Statutory Harbour Authority with statutory jurisdiction on the River Tees for such part of the river as lies within its jurisdiction, and is authorised to demand, take and recover conservancy dues on ships and goods in accordance with section 26(2) of the Harbours Act 1964.

In addition PDT has powers in accordance with section 71 of the Tees and Hartlepools Port Authority Act 1966 to demand, take and recover in respect of any floating manufactured article (not being a ship within the meaning of the Harbours Act 1964) entering, using or leaving the harbour such dues as it thinks fit.

Definitions

In this Schedule of Conservancy Dues unless the context otherwise requires:

"Barge" means any non-propelled or selfpropelled cargo carrying vessel categorised as a barge by the International Maritime Organisation;

"DWT" means deadweight tonnage;

"Goods" means any cargo and includes but is not limited to any fish, livestock and animals of all descriptions;

"GT" means the gross tonnage shown on the International Tonnage Certificate (1969) issued under the provisions of the International Convention on Tonnage Measurement of Ships 1969;

"Port" means the geographical limits of the harbour within which PDT in its capacity as the Statutory Harbour Authority exercises its statutory powers and duties in relation to the River Tees, being the relevant part of the area defined in Schedule 2 to the Tees and Hartlepools Port Authority Act 1966 as from time to time amended, modified or extended:

"Ship" where used as a noun, includes Vessels and every description of vessel used in navigation, seaplanes on the surface of the water and hovercraft;

"Vessel" means every description of vessel however propelled or moved and includes anything constructed or used to carry persons or goods by water.



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Section A - Conservancy Dues on Ships - Ships (other than Barges)

Rates are charged on GT and apply to all Ships entering the Port (where a GT is not available 90% of the DWT of the Ship will be treated as if it were the GT of the Ship).

NOTES

- 1. A Ship entering the Port to discharge one cargo and backload with another will pay full Conservancy Dues on Ships inbound and 85% Conservancy Dues on Ships outbound. If discharge and backload are not on the same berth the charge detailed in note 6 shall be levied in addition.
- 2. Ships entering the Port for the purpose of moving cargo between berths within the Port will pay 50% Conservancy Dues on Ships plus the charge detailed in note 3.
- 3. When transferring cargo between any installations within the Port each occurrence will incur 50% Conservancy Dues on Ships and 50% Conservancy Dues on Goods in addition to the charge levied under note 2.
- 4. In addition to the Conservancy Dues on Ships levied on a Ship when first entering the Port, Ships returning from the Tees Bay area of the Port under the same charter party having previously entered to partially complete the same charter party and having not left the Port will pay 25% Conservancy Dues on Ships on the second entry and each subsequent entry provided each entry is under the same charter party.
- 5. Ships returning from the Tees Bay area of the Port under a new charter party or having left the Port will be considered a new voyage and will pay 100% Conservancy Dues on Ships.
- **6.** In addition to the Conservancy Dues on Ships levied on a Ship when first entering the Port, Ships moving between berths within the Port will pay 15% Conservancy Dues on Ships per move.
- 7. Conservancy Dues on Ships on small pleasure craft are subject to special arrangements, details of which will be supplied on application to PD Ports commercial team.
- 8. For any other circumstances or clarification contact PD Ports commercial team.
- **9.** For the avoidance of any doubt the OPRC charge (see Section D1) and the Port Waste Charges (see Section D2) will be payable in addition to the above.



Section B - Conservancy Dues on Ships - Barges

Rates are charged on GT and apply to all Barges whether entering or leaving the Port (where a GT is not available, 50% of the DWT of the Barge will be treated as if it were the GT of the Barge).

NOTES

- 1. In addition to Conservancy Dues on Ships charged in accordance with the above, PDT reserves the right to levy a supplementary charge of £1.78 per GT where a Barge proceeds to load or discharge cargo in an end on position to a berth.
- 2. In addition to Conservancy Dues on Ships charged in accordance with the above, a Barge moving between any installation within the Port will pay 50% Conservancy Dues on Ships plus 50% Conservancy Dues on Goods per move if moving cargo.
- 3. For the avoidance of any doubt dues are payable on both inward and outward movements.
- 4. For any other circumstances or clarification contact PD Ports commercial team.
- **5.** For the avoidance of any doubt the OPRC Charge (see Section D1) and the Port Waste Charges (see Section D2) will be payable in addition to the above.



Section C - Conservancy Dues on Goods

Conservancy Dues on Goods apply to all Goods moved within, imported to and/or exported from the Port.

1. Oil Pollution Preparedness, Response and Co-Operation ('OPRC')

2. Port Waste Charges

To be paid by all Vessels over 24m LOA visiting the Port, other than those in possession of an exemption certificate issued by Maritime Coastguard Agency.

Please note separate charges apply for amounts of waste in excess of the stated limits and for ship generated waste that is not classified as galley waste.

The waste removal service will be subject to the terms and conditions of the contractor(s) authorised by PDT from time to time to provide such service. Copies of any applicable terms and conditions are available on request from the Harbour Master. Masters or their agents shall ensure completion of the CERS workbook for any waste discharged.

Full details of the waste removal services may be obtained from the Harbour Master's Office.

3. Port Welfare Contributions

Vessels visiting the Port will be charged a voluntary welfare levy, calculated as shown in the table below. All parties have the option to decline the opportunity to contribute and will be credited accordingly.

Those sums identified as 'Seafarer's Charities' above are collected on behalf of the North East Branch of the Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers and the Tees and Hartlepool Port User's Association, who distribute the funds to the relevant charities.



Section E - General

- 1. All services and facilities provided or procured by PDT shall be subject to the PD Teesport Limited General Conditions covering the services undertaken and facilities provided by PD Teesport Limited dated 20th November 2023, as amended or replaced.

- 2. Both Conservancy Dues on Ships and Conservancy Dues on Goods are payable on demand in accordance with Sections 71 to 81 of the Tees and Hartlepool's Port Authority Act 1966. All invoices are payable immediately upon issue by PDT unless alternative payment terms are agreed by PDT in advance of a port call, subject at all times to a satisfactory credit check. Interest will be charged at 5% above the base rate of the bank of England from time to time on any outstanding overdue balance monthly.
- 3. As soon as possible but always within 24 hours of sailing, all Ships or their appointed agent, must provide a full and complete Tees Declaration submitted by email to sales.ledger@pdports.co.uk. PDT reserves the right to request further information and documents to validate the information submitted on the Tees Declaration.
